The EPO may also be invited by Iraqi Customs, Iraqi Ministry of health or COSQC representatives to see opening of containers to check that the goods match what has been identified in the CoC. Upon Satisfactory completion of the inspection, the EPO will issue a Release note which will be provided together with the CoC to Customs to continue clearance process.
